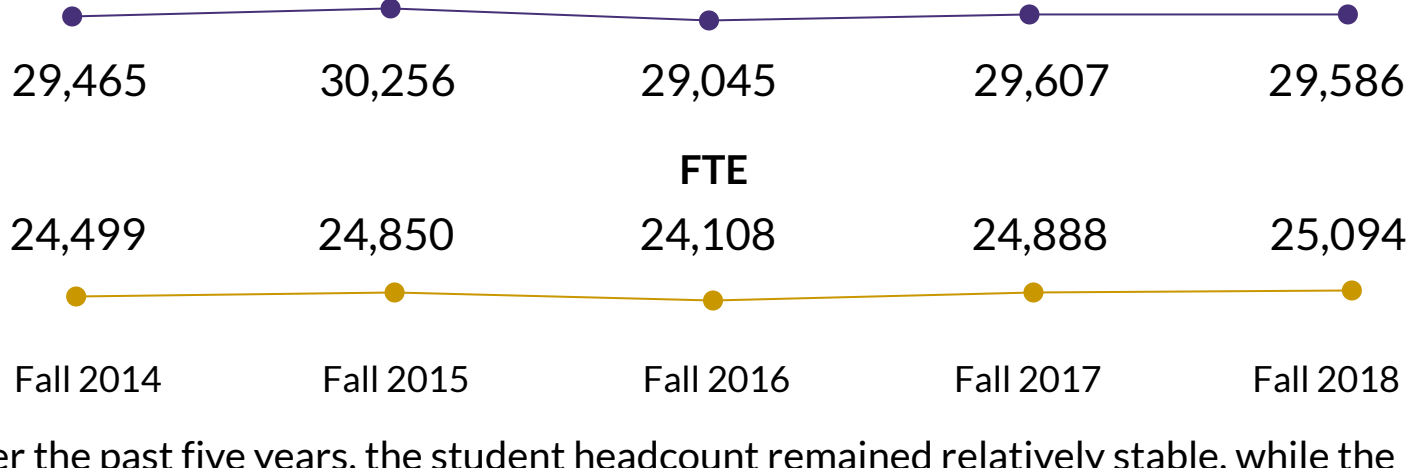


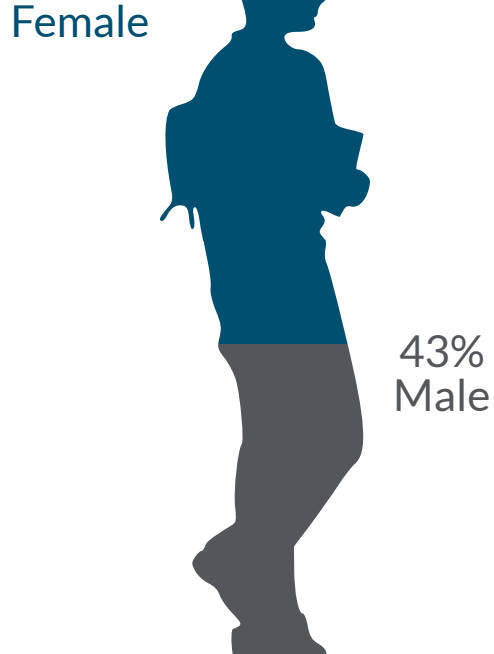
# San Francisco State University Fall 2018 Student Population

## Current Enrollment 29,586 Students



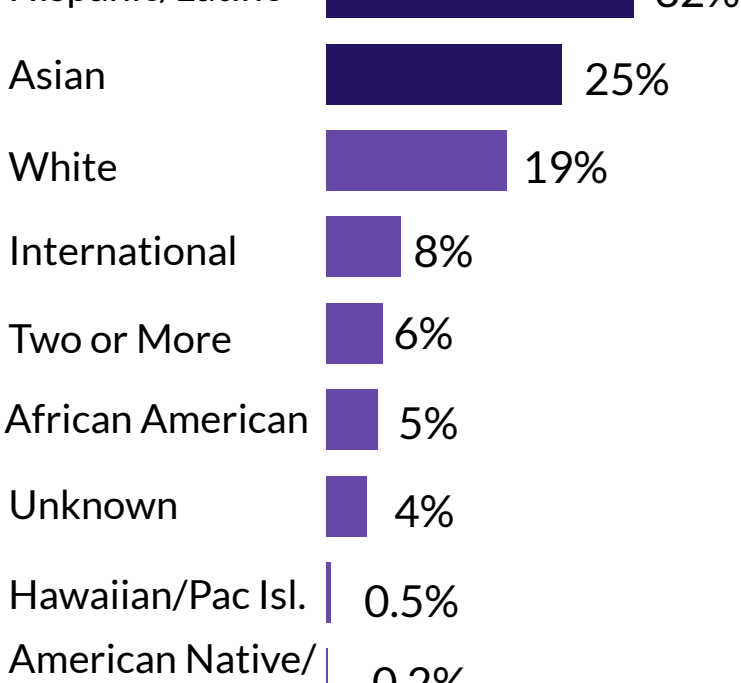
Over the past five years, the student headcount remained relatively stable, while the Full-time Equivalent (FTE) enrollment peaked in fall 2018.

Females continue to outnumber males by approximately 14% in fall 2018.

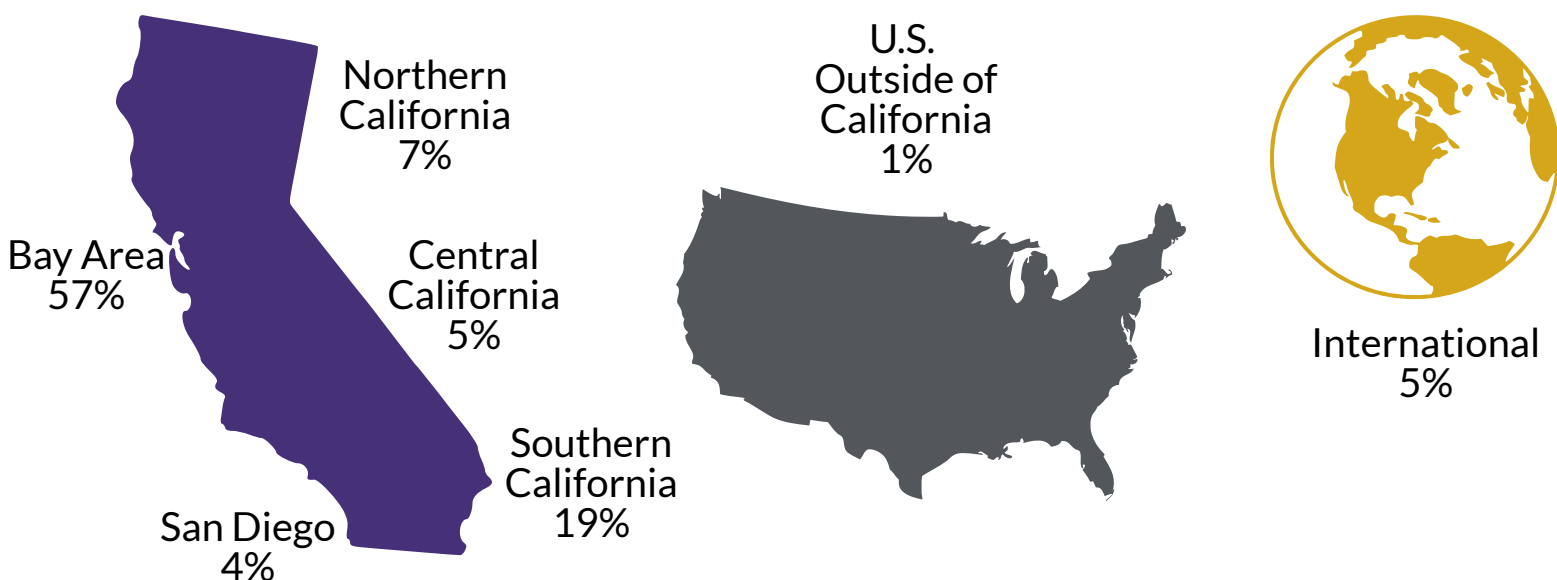
### Ethnicity



In fall 2018, over half the students enrolled are either Hispanic/Latino or Asian.

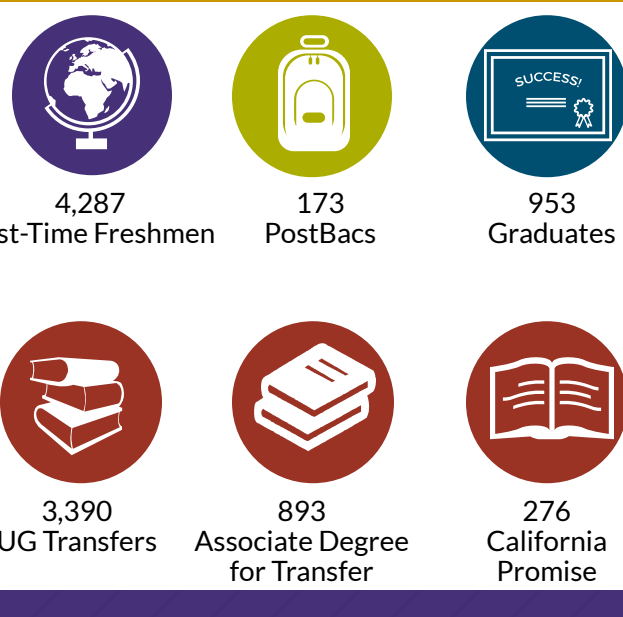

## Residence at Time of Application

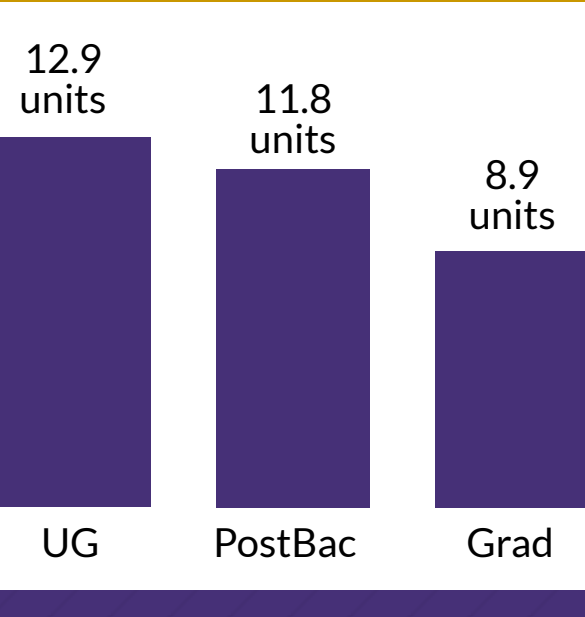


The majority of our students come from the Bay Area (57%). However, San Francisco State continues to attract students from Southern California and San Diego (23%).

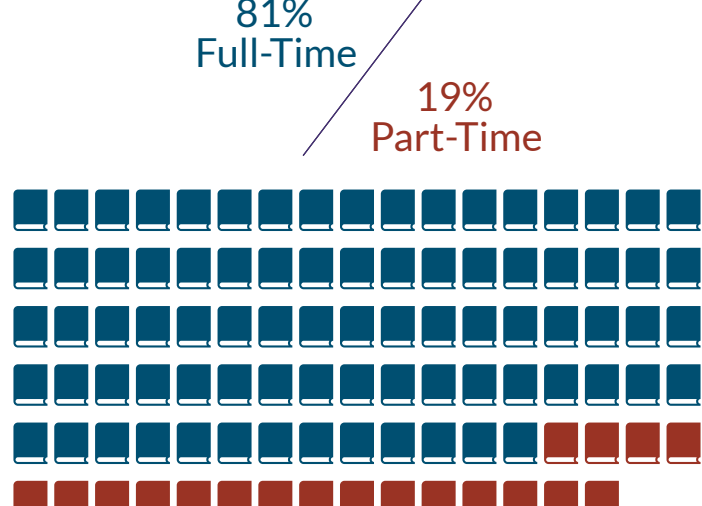
## New Student Headcount



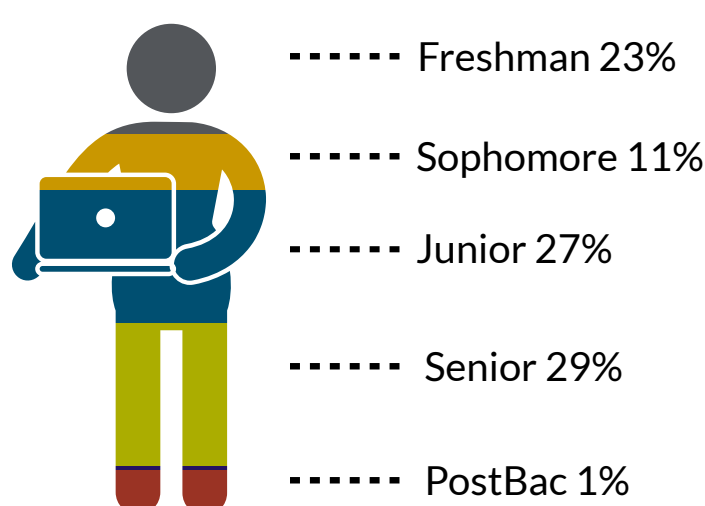
## Avg. Units Enrolled

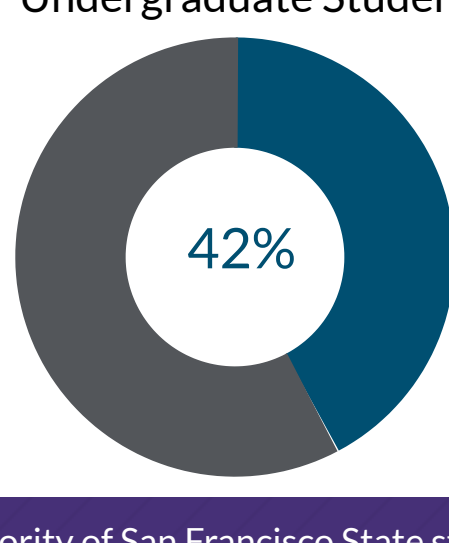

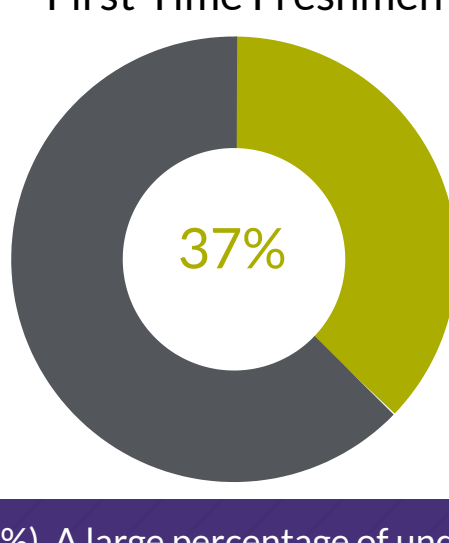
## Pell Eligibility

Percentage of First Generation First-Time Freshmen



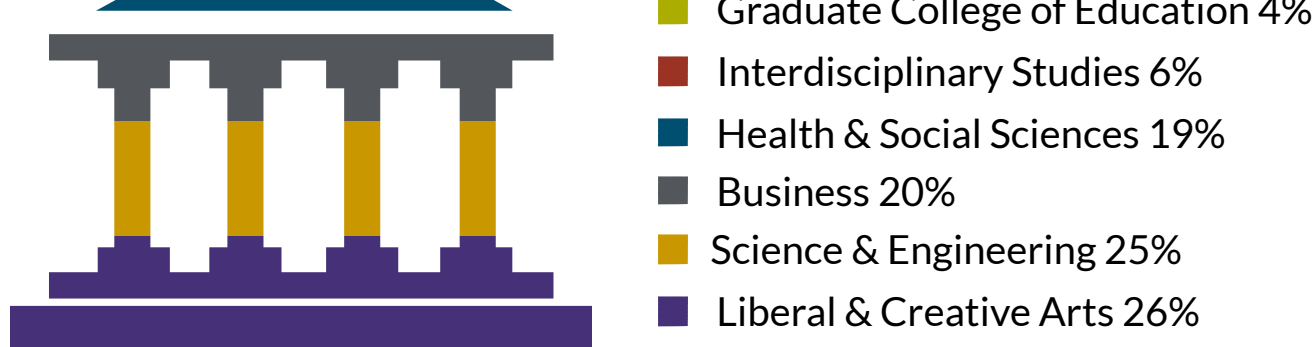
The majority of San Francisco State students are full-time (81%). A large percentage of undergraduate students are pell-eligible (42%) and many of our first-time freshmen are first generation (37%).

\*First-Generation: Neither parent/guardian (or single parent/guardian) ever attended college.

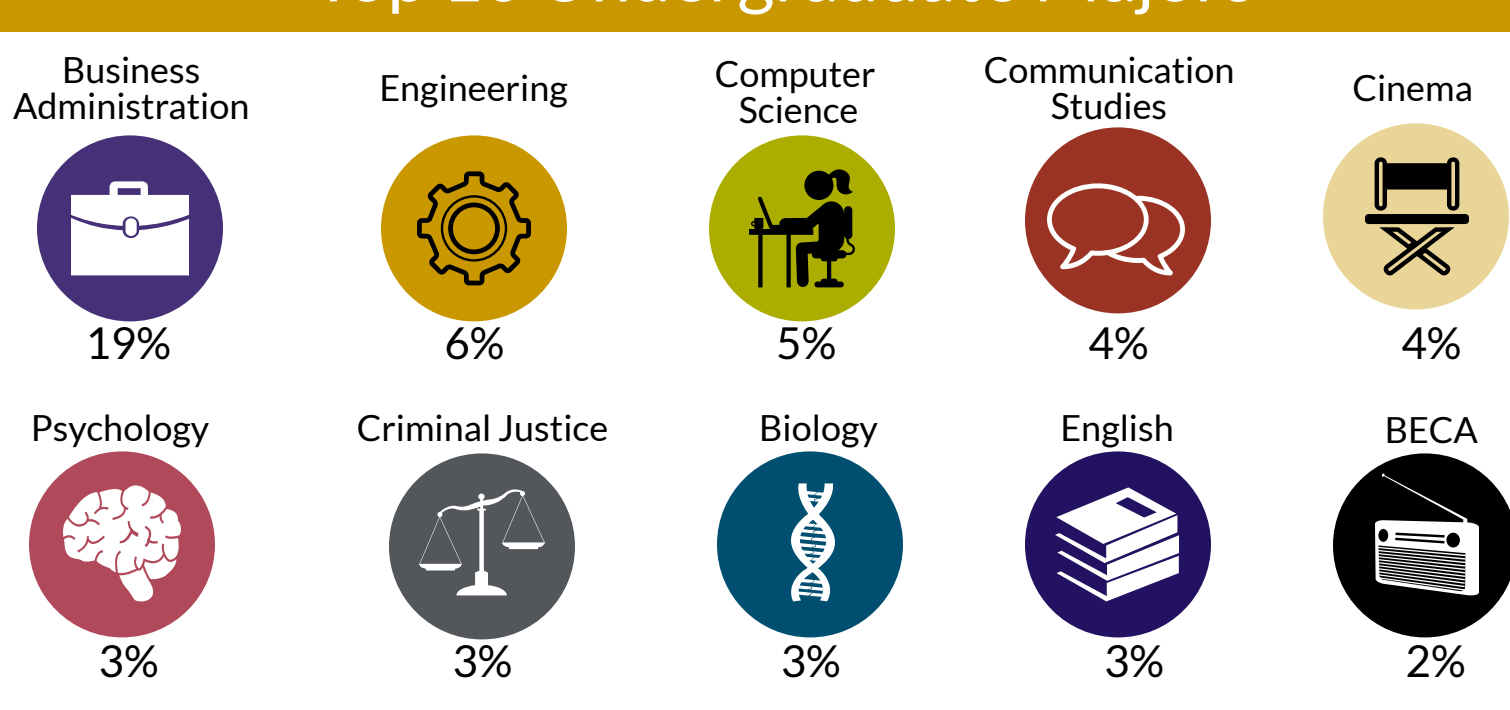
## Enrollment by College

Percentage of Students Enrolled by College



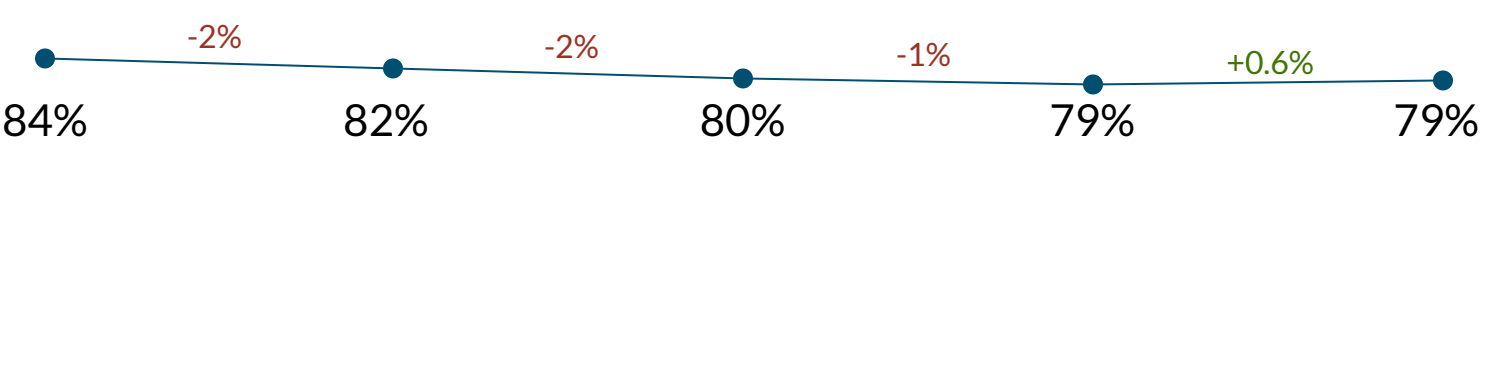
The student enrollment in Science & Engineering majors has steadily increased over the past five years.

## Top 10 Undergraduate Majors



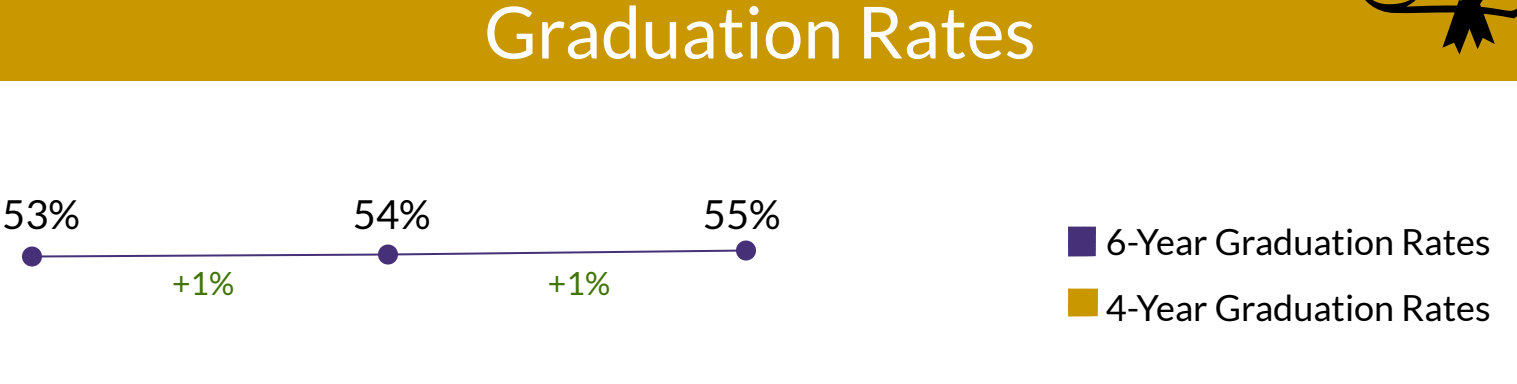
Business Administration continues to be the largest undergraduate major in fall 2018.
